- Pregnant students
- Students who live with or care for infants less than 6 months old
- Students who have a chronic medical problem (heart, lung, kidney, liver or neurological diseases, asthma, cancer, diabetes, blood disorder or compromised immune system)

Students who are members of these priority groups should notify us of your interest in receiving the vaccine by Tues. Nov. 17th at 4:00 p.m. All other students should notify us of your interest by Friday, Nov. 20th at 4:00 p.m.
